The following recipes must be used for classes 38 & 39

FRUIT CAKE

4 oz / 113 g Margarine
4 oz / 113g Caster Sugar
2 Eggs
¼ pint / 142 ml Milk less 2 tablespoons
8 oz / 227 g Self-raising Flour
1 teaspoon Mixed spice
12 oz / 340 g Mixed fruit

Cream margarine and sugar, then gradually add lightly beaten eggs and milk. Fold in sieved flour and spice, then add fruit. Put mixture in 7-7½ in / 18-19 cm greased tin. Bake at gas mark 3-4 or 325 F / 163 C for 1-1½ hours

VICTORIA SANDWICH

6 oz / 170 g Margarine
6 oz / 170 g Caster sugar
3 eggs
6 oz / 170 g Self-raising flour

Cream the margarine and the sugar, add the beaten eggs a little at a time. Fold in sieved flour. Place in two 7 in / 18 cm tins and bake for 20-30 min at 325-350 F / 163-177 C
